Who are the Kuwaiti Shia?

Kuwait has been a small but important trade and business hub since ancient times when it served as a trading point between Mesopotamia, Persia, and India. Today, though small, it continues to play a large part on the global stage of business. Since oil was discovered in the 1930s, Kuwait's money and global influence have been on the rise. They have moved from being a nation of trading, fishing, and pearl diving to a bustling urban center. They are a country with much wealth and hold the 3rd highest number of millionaires per capita in the world, yet much of the wealth is not distributed and there is still poverty and marginalization.

The nation of Kuwait is populated predominantly by foreigners. Only 15 million of the country's 4 million, are Kuwaiti. Kuwait nationals are ~70% Sunni and ~30% Shi'ite. Though religious denominations are a politically sensitive issue, the two factions have learned to coexist peacefully. The Shia minority who are often descendants of Iran or Iraq, however, do face some discrimination. Seventy percent of the Shia are of the Bidoon people (meaning without) who were never legally registered as citizens when the state was formed, making them a stateless people. They are not eligible for passports, most government jobs, and are not allowed to attend public schools, The Bidoon stand in stark contrast to the freedoms the rest of the country hold.



Kuwait is a modernized country with more freedoms for women and cultural expression than many gulf countries. Women outnumber men in the workforce 53 to 47 and attend university more than their male peers. Kuwait is known as the Hollywood of the Gulf. There is a great love for theater and the arts and they are the largest producer of TV shows in the Arabian Gulf.



Pray

Engage

There is great need for authentic Christian witnesses among Kuwaitis. Engaging with Kuwaitis must be intentional since they make up a minority of the population in their own country. Laborers should come with the intention of building their work and social lives with Kuwaitis.

Those who wish to minister in Kuwait can only maintain a presence with a work residency visa. There are many opportunities in business, health, and education fields to obtain visas. Most secure a professional job from outside the country, before taking up residency. Work can be labor-intensive and laborers must protect themselves from burnout in order to maintain longevity.

Workers should consider spending a year or two studying Arabic before arriving and then continuing with tutors upon arrival. Some who are not able to have a gap in their resume have found success in pre-field online programs followed by language intensives during their breaks.
