Who are the Saudi Najdi?

The Saudi Najdis are found in the geographic center of Saudi Arabia, including the country's capital Riyadh. The Najdis, are the ruling people of Saudi Arabia and include the Al Saud family who rose to power after the fall of the Ottoman Empire. Abdulaziz bin Abdul Rahman (aka Ibn Saud) united the Najdi and Hijazi regions to form the kingdom of Saudi Arabia in 1932. The Al Saud family collaborated with the Wahab family enabling the rise of Wahabism, a strict Islamic sect that strives to return to orthodox fundamentalist Islam.

Throughout the 20th C., Saudi Arabia rose to prominence in the world arena due to its vast oil resources. It is now one of the world's wealthiest nations and its influence is farreaching. Saudi Arabia continues to be very religiously conservative and there is a constant tension between preserving the past and moving towards the future.

Despite gaining the right to vote and drive very recently, there are still many restrictions on women in the country. Women are still restricted in dress and often are required to

seek permissions from their male guardians.



Saudi Arabia is currently moving towards a diversified economy so that they will not continue to be dependent on oil reserves. The Crown Prince Mohammad bin Salman's Vision 2030 seeks to modernize while still preserving their conservative heritage.

Engage
