# Banjarmasin





Banjarmasin is the largest city in South Kalimantan and home of the Banjar People. It is situated on the eastern side of the Barito River, about 22km from the south coast of

the island of Borneo. Together with its neighbouring city, Banjarbaru, it forms the ninth largest metropolitan city in Indonesia.

It has remained an important harbour city since ancient times. It sits at the junction of the Barito & Martapura rivers, which play a significant role in the Banjarese way of life. Each morning there are floating markets where farmers and merchants trade their goods on boats.

#### Language

Banjarese is the spoken language of the indigenous communities of South and Central Kalimantan. It is recognised as a separate language by the Indonesian government, but is essentially a dialect of Malay and not widely spoken outside of the region. Bahasa Indonesia is the official language in Kalimantan.

### Religion

Being Banjarese by definition includes professing Islam; its influences can be seen in every aspect of individual and family life. There is also a traditional animistic undercurrent in their belief system, teaching that certain supernatural powers live in objects such as stones, trees and mountains.

#### Economy

Agriculture is the most common occupation among the Banjarese. A vast area of tidal swampland has been reclaimed for wet-rice fields, fruit and vegetables. Many Banjarese women sell produce from their boats at the pasar terapung (floating market).

## Prayer


- Praise God for the Banjar who have decided to follow Jesus.

**Language Learning:** Long-term workers in Banjarmasin will need to learn Bahasa Indonesian. Language schools are available in various locations. This option can provide a visa for up to two years.
