ABOUT THE STRATEGIC CITY OF JAIPUR

Over a half million *Urdu speaking Muslims in Jaipur* are unreached—with **only a TENTH of ONE percentage of the total city population professing Christ**. Muslims in Jaipur are also unengaged—with only a handful of cross-cultural workers remaining in the city, mostly focused on Hindus.

Jaipur is the capital and largest city of the Indian state of Rajasthan—and is a draw for the historical tourists (imagine 12th century Kingdoms, Rajas, Moguls, palaces and tigers).

Many Muslims live in the middle to lower economic status. Opportunities exist to engage Muslims in the Jem stones cutting and polishing businesses, block printing, and tourism.

Jaipur is densely populated although good housing is available. A number of parks sprinkle throughout the city making for outdoor family activities and exercise.

Jaipur, originally the Kingdom of Amber, is home to abundant beautiful historical sites like the Amir Palace, Jai Mahal, City Palace and others.


