

With its tantalizing fusion of spices and colors and influences, it is no wonder Fès (Fez) is widely regarded as the center of traditional Moroccan culture and language. In the 13th century, the city developed into an intellectual center and a hub for Islamic education, earning its name as the Athens of Africa and still boasting the world's oldest functioning educational institution. Fés remains a **spiritually influential city** for the entire country.

Step back in time through the Blue Gate into the medieval labyrinth of the Fès medina. The world's largest car-free urban center is teeming with life! Vendors, locals, and tourists crowd the medina's 9,500 alleys. Aromas of fresh mint tea and fragrant spices mix with sounds of locals and vendors haggling over prices, friends telling stories, the braying of a donkey, and the rhythmic pounding of copper artisans. Some 200K, of the 1-million residents of Fès, live within the old city. Outside the gates, life is fairly modern. Education is prized. Family and religion are a priority. People are both welcoming and warm, but simultaneously wary to trust, even each other. They do not know the firm foundation of Jesus. They pursue righteousness in the only ways they've known how, but most do not know the straight path of God, in Christ who is the way, the truth and the life. But...
